APRD provides 15 miles of trails, 20 parks, an award-winning recreation center, a large skate park and an outdoor swimming complex. These amenities were funded and are supported in a large part by property taxes levied by the district. As the district continues to grow, APRD will strive to continue to meet its citizen's needs.
